

Provide students with multiple, authentic ways to demonstrate mastery of course concepts, skills, and habits of mind.

## Explore Alternative Exam Formats

- Oral Interviews
- Presentations (Individual/Group)
- Projects (Individual/Group)
- Papers, ePortfolios, etc.



- Publish consistent and predictable due dates.
- Use rubrics to make grading criteria clear and to minimize grading conversations.



Break a larger assessment up into small steps completed over time.

## Build flexibility into your expectations

## High-stakes exam? Consider:

- Make it open book
- Extend time limits
- Alternate question types
- Create individual/group components
- Use self-grading exam items when possible
- Employ a grade scheme that includes partial credit

Maybe:

- Allow three 'late' assignments
- Drop the lowest grade
- Allow a 24-window on late assignments, etc



Quickly check for student completion of assignments at the time they're due, and send an email reminder to those who've missed the deadline.
